

American Flags for 9N

The Town is pleased to announce that we will be adding some Americana to the National Grid poles that line State Route 9N next spring.

The town has obtained approval from National Grid to hang American Flag banners. The banners will cover nearly 3/4 of a mile from Grange Road to the Greenfield Elementary School.

We plan to hang the flags from May until late November, through Veterans Day.

"We are excited to add this bit of patriotism and beauty to our Town's center," said Town Supervisor Kevin Veitch.

Our Highway Department will order and install them each year.

Notice About Fire Inspections



Businesses: Please be aware that our Code Enforcement team will begin annual fire inspections this winter. You may receive a letter requesting an appointment for this inspection. Please know that we are conducting these inspections at the mandate of NYS. It isn't our intention to issue violations, but to bring every business in Greenfield up to the safety standards required by law. We will work with you to help you get compliant. We will share in our initial letter what items NYS requires at each business location. Thank you.

Exemption Information




Notice of Possible Eligibility for Senior Citizen Exemption

- Property owners 65 years of age and older MAY be eligible for exemption on their PRIMARY residence.
- Household income in the Saratoga Springs School District MUST be below \$37,400 to qualify. Household income in the Corinth School District MUST be below \$35,700 to qualify.
- MUST apply by March 1, 2024 with application, proof of age and 2022 income to Assessor's Office.
- Call 518-893-7432, ext. 302 with questions or to request an application.

Please note there are other exemptions available for Veterans, physically disabled, clergy and others. Visit our website for more information.

Power Outage Tips from NYS





Community Center Survey Results

Thank you residents for taking the time to give us your input on building a new Community Center. Here's a look at some of the data.

- 368 residents responded to the survey. Thank you!
- 86% of respondents are in favor of a new Community Center.
- 90% of responders are in favor of the Town charging a fee for residents to use for personal use (nonprofits would still be free).
- Residents strongly support the ideas of concerts, cultural events and holiday events at the facility.

Winter Safety at Home

The Town of Greenfield would like to make sure our residents remember some important homeowner safety tips during the snowy season.

- Be sure to clear snow from all of your home vents, including those on the roof. If snow drifts are blocking vents from dryers, fans, ovens and especially furnaces, this can be life threatening.
- Keep your sidewalks and driveways clear of snow for emergencies.
- Be sure basement egress windows are

clear of snow.

- Please know there is a local Town Code preventing residents from parking cars on Town roads in the winter. The vehicle can be towed. It is important for our snow plows to be able to keep streets clear. Also please do not plow driveway snow into the roadways.
- Be sure to check fire and carbon monoxide detectors.



Be sure to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning by keeping vents clear from snow and removing ice build up.

- Have your chimney cleaned and looked at regularly by a professional.
- Have your furnace maintained by a professional.

Road Safety Info

You may have noticed some additional signage added to the four-way stop at Middle Grove and South Greenfield Rd. We are constantly making safety upgrades.

This year, our Highway Department has put in a request to New York State to change our Town road speed limits to 45 mph. Stay tuned.

If you have a specific safety concern related to roads, your best bet is to write a letter to our Town Board. Even if the road is a state or county road, we can use these letters to help make our case for action.

Chickens?

No new regulations or initiatives have been introduced relating to hobby farming. Our code is similar to other towns in Saratoga County and went into effect 3/22/2007.
